Narrative	

The theme for Y9 is Natural Form. Focussing on one theme enables a thorough exploration both technically and art historically. Familiarity with assessment objectives is underlined as valuable to understanding and progress. An emphasis is placed on research, experimentation with materials and processes alongside developing skills in annotation and image decoding. When enough studies have been completed a final piece to sum up investigations is planned and completed. This can take the form of a two- or three-dimensional piece.
